About the Project

The HHS IHS HIT Modernization Project is sponsored by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Office of the Chief Technology Officer (HHS OCTO) in conjunction with the Indian Health Service (IHS) to provide an analysis and recommendations to HHS concerning the modernization of the IHS Health Information Technology (HIT) system. This project is anticipated to be the first step of a multi-faceted undertaking. This first phase aims to evaluate the current state of HIT across the I/T/U (Indian Health Service/ Tribally operated/Urban programs) and to identify alternatives to aid the HHS, IHS, and Tribal Leaders in their future HIT decisions.

This pre-conference listening session will allow participants to answer the question **"What does modernization look like from the end-user perspective?"** and will help inform the HHS and IHS about the next steps necessary to achieve a successful Modernization effort. Listening sessions and site visits are integral part of the qualitative analysis workstream of this project and are conducted using the Human-Centered Design (HCD) framework in the evaluation process.
